

Creating an Article Link

Once you have found the article you want, look for the persistent URL (link) to that article. These may be found in the article's record as follows:

- Copy and paste the persistent URL into the [Link Generator](#) to get it ready for Blackboard. The link generator will add the highlighted prefix:

Follow the instructions and copy the highlighted link into your Blackboard site using the guidelines below.

Please use a complete citation for each article you post to Blackboard and give credit to the database where you found the article. If a link doesn't work students will still be able to find the article.
